Rob Boss

Spring Arbor University

Rob Boss, a senior forward at Spring Arbor University, has found much success throughout his four years of college. In basketball he averaged 12.6 points, 5.8 rebounds, and 2 assists per game; he has 1,610 career points and 822 career rebounds, 11th in school history. In the classroom he maintains an impressive 3.80 GPA with a business major. This is the second year Rob has been named to BCAM's Academic Team.

Manny Harris

University of Michigan

This junior guard from the University of Michigan averaged 18.2 points per game this season, 6.1 rebounds, and 4.1 assists per game. Manny holds a 3.23 GPA. He received the Academic Award for the All-Big Ten team and was voted pre-season All-Big Ten. This is Manny's second year being named to the BCAM Men's Academic/ Athletic Honors Team.

John Mantel

Calvin College

John Mantel has been had a major impact on the Calvin basketball team for the last four years. As a senior center this year he averaged 14.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. He has started for the last three and a half years and was voted first team all-conference for the last two years. He helped lead his team to back-to-back conference championships in 2009 and 2010. Along with being an exceptional basketball player, he maintains a 3.27 GPA with an engineering major.

Scott Perkins

Lake Superior State University

This senior guard calls Perrysburg, OH home, but has made a name for himself at Lake Superior State University. He averaged 17.8 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game this year and started all 28 games. He was a 2009 John Wooden Citizen's Cup semifinalist. He finished his career with 1,282 points and 182 three-pointers. He was named to the All-GLIAC North Division First Team. He is an active member of LSSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and holds a 3.58 GPA with a psychology major.

Joe Prepolec

Kalamazoo College

Joe Prepolec is a sophomore center who has learned quickly how to be successful both on and off the court. He has a 3.5 GPA with an economics major and was given the Best First-Year Student Award in both the economics and physical education departments. On the court he averaged 12.6 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per game. He set the single season record for blocks, with 59 and led the team in scoring for 14 games. He was voted 2009-2010 Team MVP and 2009-2010 All-MIAA 1st Team.
