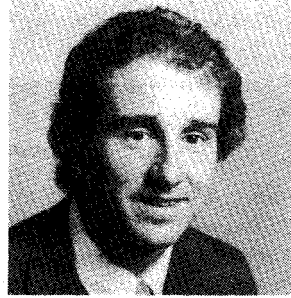


College Coach of the Year

We are pleased to announce this year's College Coaches of the Year. **Jud Heathcote** and **Bob Taylor** are this year's recipients. Jud's 1989-90 season was certainly one which he will never forget. The Spartans finished with 34 wins and 6 losses, and lost to Georgia Tech in overtime in the Southeast Regional Semifinals. They finished 1st in the Big Ten and Jud was named **National Coach of the Year**. On Feb. 10, 1990 he became the winnest coach in MSU history. We could go on and on about Jud and the support he has given BCAM and basketball in Michigan. We congratulate him on his many honors and victories.

Bob Taylor of Oakland University has had his name in every BCAM newsletter for the last 3 years, as he is the first board member to represent the college coaches. This year the board asked Bob to leave during the discussion of College Coach of the Year, a responsibility he has carried out since its inception. The board unanimously voted to name Bob as our choice this year. He has led the 1990 Oakland University women's team to the semifinals of the NCAA II in Pomona, California. Bob has won back to back GLIAC championships in the last two years. His record is 98-21 over the last 4 years.
