



1991 MR. BASKETBALL

On March 18, to the surprise of only those who have not read the sports pages these past four years, Chris Webber was named as the 11th recipient of BCAM's Hal Schram Mr. Basketball award. Webber, who received 693 election points, was followed by Detroit Southwestern's Jalen Rose with 216 points. Todd Lindeman (Iron Mountain N. Dickinson), Jesse Drain (Saginaw), and David Washington (Albion) were the next top vote getters.

As a starter, Webber led his Birmingham Detroit Country Day to two state championships and a 92-12 record over three seasons. This season, the exciting 6'10" star averaged 28.3 points per game, 13 rebounds, 6.5 blocks, and 3.7 assists as he led his team to their third consecutive state championship. He's scored 24.5 points a game and pulled down 12.8 rebounds a game over the course of his high school career.
