2010 BCAM ALL-STAR FESTIVAL

Brighton High School was once again home to the 2010 Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan All-Star festival on Saturday August 7th. The day consisted of 4 games and the Miss and Mr. Basketball presentations. Girls class C-D players opened the day at 11:00 am followed by the A-B girls at 1:00. C-D boys took the floor at 3:00 and the A-B boys finished the day at 5:00 pm. East Lansing's Klarissa Bell was awarded her Miss Basketball plaque and Keith Appling from Detroit Pershing took home the boys Mr. Basketball hardware.

The day got off to a great start with an exciting C-D girls game. The Black team was led by the high scoring duo of Jessalyn Engelsma (Grand Rapids Covenant Christian) and Monica Confer (New Lothrop). Engelsma was scoring inside and out and every time the White team would get close. Confer would hit a big three. The White team hung close with Marissa DeMott (Sandusky) having 13 of her 19 points in the first half. The Black team led 49-41 at the half. White made a run in the second half led by Ashlende Teller (Jonesville) and Shirrell Williams (Detroit Allen). Engelsma and Confer were too much, and the Black team defeated the White 88-78. The MVP award for the White team was Marissa DeMott - 19 points, 8 rbds., 3 assists and 4 blocks.
