Vast talent has made Detroit Redford's Corperryale Harris this year's Mr. Basketball. The next question: Is he still ...

MICHIGAN?

Corperryale Harris knew it was coming.

He had just picked up the Hal Schram Mr. Basketball Award, given annually to the state's best senior, but the first question asked of him was about Tommy Amaker, who was fired Saturday as Michigan's basketball coach.

"I'm going to wait and see who they hire," said Harris, the 27th winner of the prestigious award, selected by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan in conjunction with the Free Press. "But my heart is still with Michigan." Harris, a 6-5 guard from Detroit Redford, signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Michigan but could ask the university for a release from his commitment. If Michigan were to deny the request, Harris could transfer but then would have to sit out a season.

Saturday was bittersweet for Harris. His coach, Ken Flowers, called him in the early afternoon to let him know he would be named Mr. Basketball.

Thirty minutes later Amaker called Harris.

"His voice sounded regular... he first was calling to congratulate me on my game," Harris said of Amaker, who attended Redford's

regional final win over Taylor Truman on Friday. "I told him I won Mr. Basketball and he was excited again.

"Then he told me he was fired. I was shocked because he had such a good recruiting class coming in."

The class includes 6-5 guard Alex Legion of Oak Hill (Va.) Academy and 6-0 guard Kelvin Grady of East Grand Rapids. Amaker had some advice for Harris.

"He told me 'Michigan is still Michigan,' "Harris said. "It's still a good school."

As for the honor, when Flowers first saw Harris as a 5-7 freshman, he didn't think he was looking at a

future Mr. Basketball.

His big brother, Alfonzo Harris, 24, didn't think so either.

"It's unexplainable," said Alfonzo, who was on hand Monday to see his little brother accept the award. "I still see him as that little guy running around getting on my nerves."

But by the time Harris — whose nickname is Manny — was a sophomore, he had grown into a 6-2 guard. That year Redford won the first of three consecutive Detroit Public School League titles.

"That year... is when he started to come into his own," Flowers said. "He's mature, he understands what the team needs."

Harris never stopped working on his game.

"He's always in the gym," Flowers said. "Last year they said he couldn't shoot the jump shot. Now he has a consistent shot."

Harris used that shot and his athleticism to average nearly 34 points and 12 rebounds. He is shooting 42% from the field and 82% from the free-throw line.

Harris is the first PSL player to win the award since Michigan senior Dion Harris, another Redford standout, won it in 2003.

Some observers felt Saginaw Arthur Hill's Dar Tucker had the upper hand in Mr. Bas-

ketball voting because his team won the Class A state title last season, but Harris was undaunted.

"If we were winning and I put up some good numbers, I figured I would have a chance," Harris said.

His team has been winning, and at 5 p.m. today Redford plays Osborn in the Class A state quarterfinals at Detroit Mercy's Calihan Hall.

Harris topped Tucker, Kalin Lucas (Orchard Lake St. Mary's), Laval Lucas-Perry (Flint Powers) and Durrell Summers (Redford Covenant) for the honor. Harris won with 924 points to Tucker's 900 — the closest vote since 1996.
