College Coaches of the Year

Kim Elders – Cornerstone University Men's College Coach of the Year

This past season Coach Elders led the Cornerstone University Golden Eagles to a record of 30-5. They finished their conference season with a 20-2 record, winning both his seventh regular season title and eighth Wolverine-Hoosier Conference Tournament Championship. They advanced to the second round of the NAIA Division II National Tournament in Branson, MO. This was Coach Elder's 21st season at Cornerstone University and he passed the 500 career win total early in the season.

Antoine Joubert – Oakland Community College

Men's Junior College Coach of the Year

Coach Joubert led his Oakland Community College Raiders to a 28-4 overall record and a Michigan Community College Athletic Association Co-Championship. They finished with a conference record of 16-2 and were 14-0 at home. They lost a hard fought game in the finals of the District 10 NJCAA Championship to finish their season. This was the third year in a row the Raiders have lost in the finals of the District 10 Tournament. Coach Joubert is our former 1983 Mr. Basketball Award winner.

Sue Guevara – Central Michigan University Women's College Coach of the Year

Sue Guevara has rebuilt Central Michigan back to its former glory over her first seven seasons, with the program's first MAC West title in program history. This success follows the Chippewa's first Mid-American Conference Tournament title and NCAA Appearance since 1984, during the 2012-13 season. The Chippewas have had four consecutive 20-win campaigns from 2011-14. In addition, Coach "G" has guided 19 All-MAC selections while at CMU.

Jay Ritchie – Macomb Community College Women's Junior College Coach of the Year

In his fifth year coaching the Monarchs, Jay Ritchie and the Macomb Women's Basketball Team could not be stronger, coming off of three consecutive NJCAA District H Tournament appearances. Each of the past three years, Macomb CC has advanced to the Region XII Final Four (2012-2014). Not only that, they have now won 20+ games in three consecutive seasons, including a school record 26 wins during the 2012-13 season.
