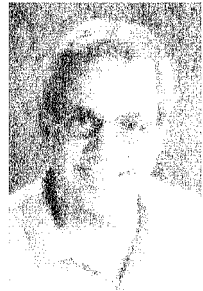


HALL of HONOR INDUCTEES

Jim Champine has been coaching basketball for the last 32 years. His career includes both boys and girls teams around the Detroit area. Jim is viewed by his players as a caring coach and great role model.

Jim's coaching career began coaching boys CYO at Detroit St Matthews in 1967. Moving to Harper Woods Schools, Jim coached at the varsity, junior varsity and junior high levels until 1980. He moved across town to Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher as an assistant varsity coach until 1986. After taking some time off he re-entered coaching in 1990 as an assistant at Macomb Community College. In 2000, Jim changed to coaching the girls as a co-coach for junior varsity at Grosse Pointe North High School where he is currently coaching.

Jim has worked at and helped run the Macomb Community College Basketball Camp from 1984-1992. Since 1992, he has served as the director of the Metro "D" Basketball Camp.

As extraordinary as that record is, running the scoreboard is not the only kind of support that Barbara has lent to the student-athletes of Benzie Central. She has kept the scorebook for the away contests for the boys JV and Varsity for 15 years. She has also promoted basketball teams by make hundreds of signs. For 25 years, she ran the boys' elementary program every Saturday morning during basketball season. To this day, she still attends many school athletic events, watching the "kids of kids" that she has taught over the years.
