COLLEGE COACHES OF THE YEAR

Already the winningest coach in the 16-year history of the Michigan Tech women's basketball program, Kevin Borseth recently completed his fourth year at the helm of the MTU hoop program and what a season it was for the Huskies. Under Borseth's guidance, Michigan Tech not only registered its best season ever at 22-7 overall, but was crowned the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular reason champions for the first time ever after posting a first-place 14-2 record. Furthermore, the Huskies qualified for the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Tournament, also a feat never accomplished before in MTU women's basketball annals. Since his arrival to Michigan Tech, Borseth has compiled a 65-46 coaching mark for a .586 winning percentage. In fact, his career victory total at the school is more than double of any other previous MTU women's basketball coach. Although this season's performance is unparalleled, the Huskies have been on a record-breaking pace the previous two hoop campaings as well going 17-11 in 1989-90 and 16-11 in 1988-89. On the basis of Kevin's outstanding 1990-91 season and his superlative career, he has been named BCAM's Women's College Coach of the Year.

Tom Villemure of Grand Valley State University is BCAM's selection as Men's College Coach of the Year. Villemure's 1990-91 squad captured the GLIAC championship with a 13-3 mark, (26-5 overall) then won the first-ever conference playoff tournament with wins over Northern Michigan and Ferris State. They advanced to the NCAA Division II Regional Tournament and defeated first-round opponent Bellarmine College 78-72, but lost to Ashland University 82-75 in the regional finals. Villemure has just completed his 19th year at the head of the Laker basketball program where he has posted a 372-197 record. In June of 1983, Tom received BCAM's Honorary "Mr. Basketball Award." Congratulations to both deserving coaches.
