

GLEN DONAHUE St. Mary's College

Glen began coaching basketball in 1959. His coaching career started at Highland Park H.S. as a J.V. Coach, made stops at St. Gabriel's and Salesian H.S.'s at the Varsity level, before going to Highland Park Community College in 1967.

During his 19 years at Highland Park his teams won 401 and lost 205. Included were 6 League championships and one State title in 1985. He went to St. Mary's College in 1985, where his won-loss record was 86-57, with a State Title in 1991. His over-all Varsity record is 538-307.

He has served as MCCAA All Star Coach and was MI College Coach of Year in 1985.

## STANLEY GOOCH Flint Central High School

Stan has spent 25 of his 32 years as a head coach, 10 years at Mott Community College (199-89) and 15 years at Flint Central H.S. (255-72) Combined won-loss record 489-169.

During his 15 years at Flint Central his teams have won 4 League titles, 8 Districts, and been in the Class A State Finals 4 times, winning 3 State Championships.

He has been High School Basketball Coach of the Year several times, BCAM 1981, MHSAA 1981, Detroit News 1982, Genesee County MSU Alumni 1981, 1983, Greater Flint CMC Club 1981, 1983, Mott Community College 1978.

TOM VILLEMURE Grand Valley S.U.

Tom has been a head coach 28 of his 30 years. He spent 8 years at the H.S. level, 2 years as an assistant at U of D before going to CVSU in 1972. His H.S. record of 119-31 included 3 League, 2 District and 1 Regional titles, and a Detroit City Championship won in 1966 by Detroit Austin H.S.

At GVSU his teams have won more than any other coach at a 4-year school. Won-loss record is 373-197. They have won 5 League and 4 District titles and made 12 post season appearances in 19 seasons, with 5 top 20 finishes.

Tom is in the UP Hall of Fame both as a player and coach and the Detroit Catholic League Hall of Fame. He was GLIAC, NCAA Region II and MI College Coach of the Year in 1991.

## WILLIAM ZABONICK Bronson H.S. (Retired)

Bill retired in 1991 after 36 years as a Varsity BB Coach, all at Bronson H.S. During that time his teams won 526 games and lost 263. Included were 17 League titles, 17 District titles, 4 Regional titles and twice his teams were in the semifinals.

Bill was a graduate of Coldwater H.S. and was inducted into their Hall of Fame in 1974. He played football for WMU and was co-captain and MVP in 1950.

In 1983 Bill was UP Class C Basketball Coach of the Year and in 1987 was the NHSCAA Region #4 Representative. Bill is also a member of the MHSAA Hall of Fame Class of 1990.
