ASSISTANT COACH - TOM DAVELAAR, Hope College

Bob was named winner of the Edward R. VanDerVoort Award by the Greater Downtown Coaches Club for contributions to high school athletics, only the second time a member of the media has won the award. He also was on the committee to bring the state tournament back to M.S.U.



MEDIA - CHUCK KLONKE, Macomb Daily/Grosse Pointe News

Chuck started covering sports during the 1968-69 basketball season for the Macomb Daily. He continued his high school sports coverage while with the Royal Oak Daily Tribune, again with the Macomb Daily and now as Sports Editor of the Grosse Pointe News. Chuck estimates that he has watched nearly 1,000 high school basketball games during his 27 years and has enjoyed his relationship with the coaches and players.

MEDIA - ED PHELPS, Channel 12 TV - Flint

Ed began his broadcasting career as a staff announcer and did radio "play-by-play" for Marshall High School sports. After a stint in Kalamazoo, he became the Sports Director for WJRT-TV in Flint. His station has presented the High School Basketball Scoreboard shows for many years for both boys' and girls' basketball.

Perhaps best known for her officiating both at the high school and college level, Evie has officiated in the "Big Ten", MAC, MIAA and various other college leagues. She has been a registered MHSAA official since 1975.

In 1990, Evie was inducted into the Catholic League Officials Hall of Fame. She stays active by working for the Trenton and Lincoln Park Recreation Departments as well as participating in the National Senior Olympics.
