To be eligible, players have to be either a starter or an important reserve and have at least a 3.2 grade point average. The BCAM teams are selected on the basis of academic achievement, athletic accomplishments, grade point average and their coach's BCAM membership.

JrTravis BaderOakland University3.45Okemos, MITravis led the country with a school and Summit League record 139 three point field goals.An All-Summit League first teamselection, he averaged 22.1 ppg.Bader graduated from Oakland in three years with a 3.45 in Communications and is currentlyworking on his master's degree.

SrBrett BelandSaginaw Valley State University3.58Menominee, MIBrett was 4<sup>th</sup> in the nation is Free Throw Percentage in 2011-12. This past season he averaged 13.0 points per game connecting on 60three point field goals.
