

## 2019 BCAM Men's and Women's College Academic-Athletic Teams

**Sr. Jason Beckman Hope College 3.68 Shelby, MI**  
 Jason's accomplishments: MIAA Academic Honor Roll (2018)...D3Hoops Second Team All-Region (2018)...NABC Second-Team All-District (2018)...MIAA Player of the Week 4X, All-MIAA First Team (2018)...D3Hoops All-Region 2nd Team 2019, MIAA Second Team (2019). He finished with 1,132 career points in just two seasons at Hope. Jason is also very active in Campus Ministries programs. He has a 3.68 GPA in Exercise Science.

**Sr. Isaiah Johnson Northern Michigan University 3.20 Whitefish Bay, WI**  
 Isaiah was the 2019 leading scorer in GLIAC, 2018 All GLIAC first team, 2016 and 2017 GLIAC All-Academic team, 7th all-time leading scorer in NMU basketball history with over 1450 total points, and a NMU Athletics Academic student-athlete of the month. He holds a 3.20 GPA in Business Accounting.

**Sr. Justin Nafso Rochester College 3.91 Walled Lake, MI**  
 Justin was selected to the 2019 WHAC All-Academic team. He has been very active with the Faith Works Group as well as Team Impact and has been involved in many service projects. This past year Justin was selected to the WHAC All-Conference first team, WHAC All-Defensive team, and USCAA All-American. He has scored 1,666 career points to go with his 653 assists. He has a 3.91 GPA in Interdisciplinary Studies.

**Sr. Tom Hamilton Spring Arbor University 3.96 Middleville, MI**  
 Tom was selected to 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-America Teams for NAIA men's basketball Second Team. Hamilton helped lead Spring Arbor University to its first-ever NAIA national championship title. He averaged 11.1 points per game this season and handed out a career-high 128 assists. He has also made a career-best 65 3-pointers and shot 47 percent from behind the arc. Tom boasts a 3.96 GPA in Accounting.

**Sr. Shawn Roundtree, Jr. Central Michigan University 3.26 Edwardsville, IL**  
 Shawn is a member of several different campus organizations including the Emerging Leaders Program, National Society of Leadership & Success and the National Society of Collegiate Scholars. He started "Roundtree's Roundtable", giving athletes a platform to voice who they are outside of sports. Athletically he was the 2017 Great Alaska Shootout MVP, 2019 3rd Team All-MAC and a 1000 Point Scorer (in just 2 years). He is a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. Shawn has earned a 3.26 GPA in Entrepreneurship.

**Jr. Cassidy Boench Grand Valley State University 3.91 Au Gres, MI**  
 Grand Valley State University junior, Cassidy Boensch, dominated on the court this season. She averaged a double-double with 19.6ppg and 11.6rpg; guiding her team to a 2018-19 GLIAC league title and an NCAA tournament bid, while compiling a 29-4 overall record. The Au Gres, Michigan native was named the 2019 GLIAC Player of the Year. In addition, Cassidy earned a spot on the NCAA DII Midwest All-Region First Team and the All-Region Tournament Team. The Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) recognized her as All-American Honorable Mention. The Lakers biomedical health science major is a Google Cloud Academic First Team All-American.

**Sr. Reyna Frost Central Michigan University 3.68 Reese, MI**  
 Central Michigan senior Reyna Frost was named the 2019 Mid-American Conference Player of the Year. She helped the Chippewas to a 25-8 record and another NCAA tournament bid. The senior rewrote the record book for the conference and the CMU women's program for career rebounds, registering 1,526. In addition, she surpassed 1,500 career points as a Chippewa. Frost had 29 double-doubles on the season, ranking her 4<sup>th</sup> in NCAA DI. As a mathematics major, she maintains a 3.68 GPA and garnered CoSIDA Google Cloud Academic All-American Third-Team accolades. The Reese, Michigan native was also named a finalist for the WBCA Katrina McClain Award, which recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.

**Sr. Jami Hubbard Albion College 3.98 Reading, MI**  
 Albion College head coach Doreen Carden wrote that "Jami was the heart and soul of our team". Her contributions on the court included 2<sup>nd</sup> in minutes played (702), defensive rebounds (108) and total rebounds (169). The Britons senior captain was a leader for her team within athletics and within the Albion community including team community service events such as Healthy Babies Day, Citizens to Beautify Albion and the Big Read initiative. She served on the Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The biology major is a three-time MIAA academic honor roll recipient. In addition, she is a teaching assistant in the cadaver labs for anatomy classes and tutor in the kinesiology department. Hubbard is the only women's basketball player in the MIAA to be voted to the Google Cloud Academic All-District team.

**Sr. Amanda Merz Davenport University 4.00 Grand Haven, MI**  
 Davenport marketing senior, Amanda Merz, has demonstrated a notable work ethic on the court and in the classroom. Amanda completed her undergraduate degree with a 4.0 GPA and began graduate school while competing as a student-athlete. In addition, Merz has helped DU make the transition from NAIA DII to NCAA DII the past two seasons. Head Coach Rick Albro stated "This young lady plays as HARD as anyone, she was our leader." Amanda concluded her senior season as 4<sup>th</sup> in GLIAC assists per game (3.7apg). When Amanda is not studying or on the court she is a resident adviser in the dorms and a student manager for the Davenport University Athletic Facilities department.

**So. Kenedy Schoonveld Hope College 3.90 Zeeland, MI**  
 Hope College women's basketball had an impressive season finishing 24-5 and advancing to the second round of the 2019 NCAA Division III tournament. Kenedy Schoonveld played a role in the team's success. She averaged 10.4 ppg in only 24 minutes of play; including consistent shooting percentages in field goals (46.3%) three pointers (35.4%) and free throws (82.4%). Her contributions landed her a spot on the MIAA 1st Team All-League. This summer, when not studying or on the basketball court, she will travel to Africa to participate in an internship with an adoption agency. Kenedy is a social work major who currently carries a 3.90 GPA.

*Each BCAM Academic-Athletic Honor Team pays tribute to five outstanding scholar-athletes from Michigan colleges and universities at the NCAA I, NCAA II, NCAA III, and NAIA levels. To be eligible, players must be nominated by their BCAM member coach, be either a starter or an important reserve, have reached sophomore standing, have participated in at least 50% of the team's games, and have at least a 3.0 GPA. The BCAM teams are selected on the basis of academic achievement, athletic accomplishments, and extra-curricular activities.*
