“Isis Johnson is a dynamic 5’ 8” combo guard who excels at scoring at all three levels—off the dribble, in the mid-range, and beyond the arc. She has seamlessly carried her momentum from last season’s state championship run, stepping up as the leader after losing four starters. A silent assassin on the court, she not only puts up points but fills the stat sheet in all facets of the game.

Defensively, she is a disruptive force, averaging 3.33 deflections and 4.06 steals per game, while also pulling down an impressive 7.0 rebounds despite her size. Offensively, she remains the focal point, consistently facing double teams, box-and-one defenses, and traps, yet still averaging 16.2 points per game. When scoring opportunities are limited, she showcases her basketball IQ by creating for teammates, dishing out 4.0 assists per game.

Leading her state championship-contending team in every major statistical category, Isis has shined against the toughest schedule in the state, regularly competing against top-ranked opponents across multiple divisions (Division I #1 Belleville, #4 Renaissance, #8 Eisenhower, #8 Wayne Memorial, Muskegon/Grand Blanc who was ranked earlier in the season, Division II #2 Tecumseh, #3 Frankenmuth, #6 Parma Western, Division III Kalamazoo Christian). Her resilience, skill, and leadership make her an invaluable player and a true standout this season.

Isis Johnson is a standout on the court and in the classroom and a dedicated community leader with a passion for making a difference. In October 2024, she spearheaded a community service project, rallying her teammates, teachers, and school staff to collect and donate new or gently used shoes for children in need. She led her team of seniors in coordinating drop-off locations, assessing needs, and personally delivering the donations.

Beyond this initiative, Isis has been involved in impactful organizations such as the Urban Alliance Workforce Training Program, where she has developed valuable professional skills. She also participated in Peace Players, earning a trip to California to collaborate with global leaders in leadership and social change. Additionally, through Enjoy Detroit, she contributed to packing backpacks filled with hygiene items for the homeless, further showcasing her commitment to service and community betterment.”
